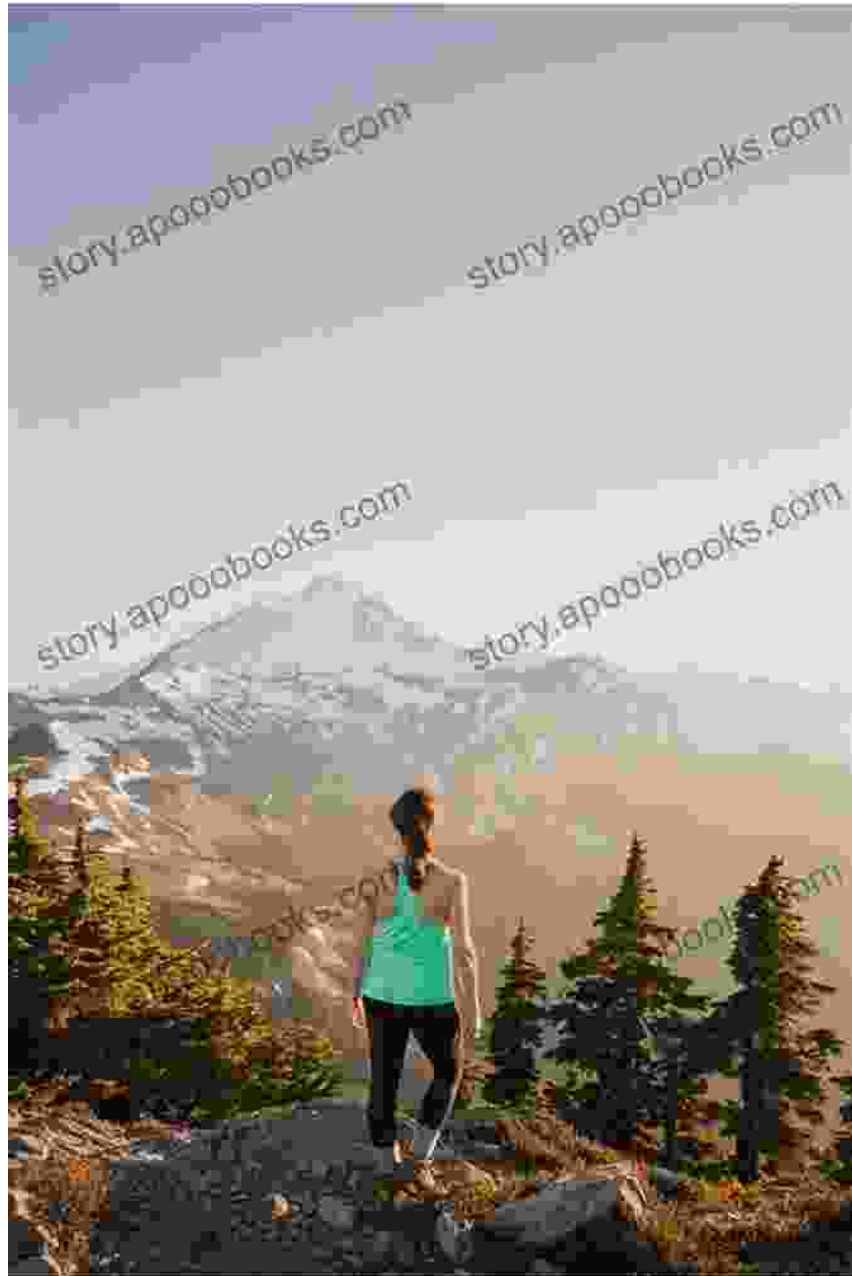
### **3. Nooksack Glacier Trail**

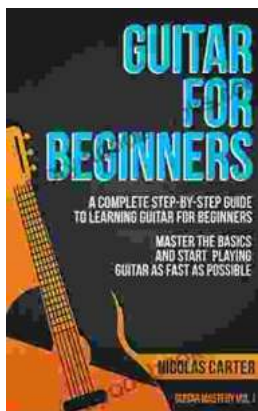

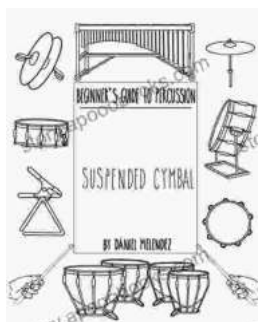
