
The Girl from Guantánamo: A Harrowing True Story of Survival, Resilience, and Redemption

In 2002, Rukhsana Aslam was a 24-year-old Pakistani woman living in London. She had a good job, a loving family, and a bright future ahead of

Aslam was arrested in December 2002 and taken to a secret detention center in Pakistan. She was held there for over a year without being charged with a crime. During that time, she was subjected to sleep deprivation, beatings, and other forms of torture.

In 2004, Aslam was transferred to Guantánamo Bay, the U.S. military prison in Cuba. She was one of only seven women ever held at Guantánamo. At Guantánamo, Aslam was subjected to even more extreme forms of torture. She was kept in solitary confinement for long periods of time, and she was forced to endure painful and humiliating strip searches.

Aslam was finally released from Guantánamo in 2006. She returned to Pakistan a broken woman. She had been tortured both physically and

In 2018, Aslam published her memoir, *The Girl from Guantánamo*. The book is a harrowing account of her time in prison, but it is also a story of hope and resilience. Aslam's story is a reminder that even in the darkest of times, the human spirit can prevail.



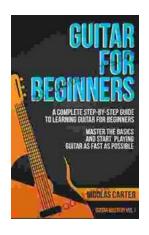
